Please provide me copies prior to c.o.b. on May 29, 199 [REDACTED] of the book, videotape and catalog you describe in "Defendant's Third Supplemental Response ..." which was faxed to my office today.

I understand you to no longer request copies of still photographs which the Government may offer at trial, but your continued request for footage of the [REDACTED] tape leads me to ask that you meet with me this coming Tuesday to view that tape (if that day is bad for your schedule, viewing it on Wednesday with [REDACTED] is another option). As my 5/21/ [REDACTED] facsimile letter tried to make clear (in fn. 1) to you, I can't tell if its four or five females shown in the series of acts shown on the tape. Thus, if the copying you seek is possible, I don't want to have the wrong four females' images copied. Additionally, nearly all the footage depicts sexually explicit conduct; the brief portions which are not do not relate to all four or five females, nor can I perceive their utility. I still wonder whether you're referring to the "right" tape.
